

Prayer References in Luke's Gospel

3 .21	When Jesus had also been baptised and was praying a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased'.	
4 .1 - 13	Temptation in the desert.	
4 . 42	At daybreak he departed and went into a deserted place	
5 .15-16	...many crowds would gather to hear him and be cured of their diseases. But he would withdraw to deserted places to pray .	
5 .33-34	(The Pharisees and Scribes) said to him, 'John's disciples, like the disciples of the Pharisees, frequently fast and pray , but your disciples eat and drink'. Jesus said to them, 'You cannot make the wedding guests fast while the bridegroom is with them, can you?'	<i>Prayers of others</i>
6 .12	During those days he went out to the mountain to pray ; and he spent the night in prayer to God.	
6 .27	Pray for those who abuse you' (<i>Part of the Beatitudes</i>)	
9 .16	Taking the five loaves and two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke them.	<i>Prayer at a meal</i>
9 .18	Once when Jesus was praying alone, with only the disciples near him, he asked them, 'Who do the crowds say that I am?'	
9 .28	Eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray . And while he was praying , the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white.	
10 .21-22	Jesus rejoiced in the Holy Spirit and said, 'I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and intelligent and have revealed them to infants; yes, Father, for such was your gracious will'.	<i>Prayer of Jesus</i>
11 . 1-4	He was praying in a certain place ... one of his disciples said to him, 'Lord, teach us to pray , as John taught his disciples'. He said to them, 'When you pray , say: Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread. And forgive us our sins, as we forgive everyone indebted to us. And do not bring us to the time of trial.'	<i>Prayer of Jesus</i>

11 .5-13	"Ask, and it will be given to you"	<i>Parable</i>
18 .1-8	"The Widow and the Judge"	<i>Parable</i>
18 .9-14	"The Pharisee and the Tax Collector"	<i>Parable</i>
20 .46-47	'Beware of the scribes...for the sake of appearances they say long prayers '	<i>Prayers of others</i>
21 .36	Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man'.	
21 .37	Every day he was teaching in the temple ... and at night he would go out and spend the night on the Mount of Olives.	
22 .17,19	He took a cup and after giving thanks... He took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it...	<i>Prayer at a meal</i>
22 .31	Simon ... I have prayed for you that your own faith may not fail'.	
22 .39-46	He said to the disciples, ' Pray that you may not come into the time of trial' Then he withdrew from them, about a stone's throw, knelt down, and prayed , 'Father, if you are willing, remove this cup from me; yet, not my will but yours be done'. When he got up from prayer , he came to the disciples and found them sleeping because of grief, and he said to them, 'Why are you sleeping? Get up and pray that you may not come to the time of trial.'	<i>Prayer of Jesus</i>
23 .34	Jesus said, 'Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing.'	<i>Prayer of Jesus</i>
23 .46	Jesus, crying with loud voice, said, 'Father, into your hands I commend my spirit'. Having said this he breathed his last.	<i>Prayer of Jesus</i>
24 .30	When he was at table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it.	<i>Prayer at a meal</i>
